Monthly Projects

September- Outline a map of the United States and label Florida.

October- Write a paragraph about a significant African American. Include a picture of this person with your paragraph.

November- Create an American Symbol replica (model). This project must also have a paragraph explaining the meaning to the American people. Here are a few examples: The American Red Cross, state flags, bald eagle, White House, and many others.

December-Create a replica (model) of a great American Invention. These projects must also include a paragraph telling about the invention and inventor. Examples: electricity, automobile, phone, television to name a few.
