Thank you for your interest in the doodle4google competition. The theme of this year's contest is "When I grow up, I hope....". These dreams and hopes could be things like: food for everyone, a skateboard that can fly, pizza trees or time machines. It should be personal and specific for each child. The more creative and unique the better!

The final drawing should be completed on the heavy cardstock entry form or attached to the final entry sheet using clear tape. Students must complete the 50-word statement about their work, (think mini artist statement), and parents must sign the form. I will mail in all of the entries from the school. This will boost the submissions because as a school we have completed the accompanying Google lesson for "**When I grow up, I hope...**" and discussed as a group the hopes and dreams we have for our future.

Students do not have to only use pencils or pens to complete their doodles. They can use any media they wish, as long as the work fits within the required doodle space. If the work is larger than the space, you may make a photo or copy and scale it to fit in the space then tape the image on the entry form. If your children wish to use three dimensional materials (Legos, beads, clay, etc...) simply photograph their artwork and attach the photo with clear tape. You may send entries to school in your child's folder or bring forms to the office and place in doodle4google basket. Please take special care to assure pages are crisp and clean with no bends, tears, smudges, etc.... **All entries must be sent to school by Wednesday, March 13. No entries turned in after this date can be sent in with the school package.**
