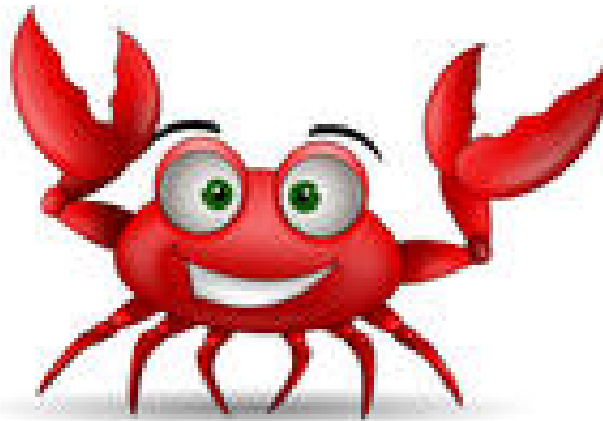

## **YOUTH PARTNERSHIP PROGRAM (YPP)**

**YPP encourages high school students to serve as community volunteers with the purpose of increasing their awareness of the needs of the community and the lifelong value of volunteerism. In order for students to document their community service they need to attend a training session. Training sessions are held on the first Tuesday of each month during lunch. Students can sign up in Student Services. Once a student has attended the training session the documented hours will become a part of the high school transcript. Service hours are required for the Bright Futures Scholarship award and for an honors diploma. The candidate must also have no unsatisfactory grades (D or F) and no unsatisfactory marks in conduct (2 or 3) during the previous grading period. Candidates cannot have any major discipline referrals and must have satisfactory attendance. Elected officers must maintain these standards throughout the duration of their term. All elected Senators will complete mandatory minimum number of volunteer hours for each quarter.
