New Smyrna Beach High School is a B rated school in southeast Volusia County, Florida. In 2017-2018, NSBHS celebrates its 100th year of continual accreditation, while The City of New Smyrna Beach celebrates its 250th anniversary.

The NSBHS vision statement is “Your Legacy Starts Here.”

Criminal Justice Academy – Gold Standard

- The Criminal Justice Academy provides students with education in law enforcement, courts, and corrections. This includes ethics, crime scene forensics, and 911 Telecommunications training. The courses include Criminal Justice Operations 1, Criminal Justice Operations 2, Criminal Justice Directed Study, (Crime Scene Investigations), and 911 Public Safety Telecommunicator. After four years of successful completion of the Criminal Justice Academy, graduates will wear pale blue cords at graduation.

- The Culinary Academy utilizes the industry-standard *ProStart* curriculum to teach students industry skills in the hospitality and tourism career cluster. After four years of successful completion of the Culinary Arts Academy graduates will wear rose pink cords at graduation.
