Take Away! Our resident cases outside of residential facilities is far lower than that of the State. We have accomplished this with very few mandates in place!

ALL 4 were ages **65** and **OVER!**

- 63 deaths (3% of all cases) 97% have survived!
- **59** of the 63 deaths occurred in individuals with severe underlying health conditions; many of those in long-term healthcare facilities
- **4** of the 63 deaths occurred in individuals with no known severe underlying conditions

ALL 4 ages **65** and **OVER!** **55** of the 63 deaths are in people ages 65 and OVER.

Take Away! COVID-19 deaths are non-existent in our 2,484 cases in individuals under age 65, with no severe underlying health conditions.

Comparing the Flu to COVID-19

People at High-Risk for Severe Illness

Similarities:

Both COVID-19 and flu illness can result in severe illness and complications. Those at highest risk include:

- Older adults
- People with certain underlying medical conditions
- Pregnant people

Differences:

The risk of complications for healthy children is higher for flu compared to COVID-19.

However, infants and children with underlying medical conditions are at increased risk for both flu and COVID-19.
