SUBJECT: Washington County School District Mask Wearing and COVID-19 Guidance and Quarantine Directions- August 2021 in Regards to Students

As our 2021-2022 school year begins, COVID-19 is on the rise again. COVID-19 prevention strategies remain important to protect our students, teachers, and staff who are not fully vaccinated.

On July 30, 2021, Governor Ron DeSantis issued Executive Order 21-175 which will ensure parent's freedom to choose if their children will wear masks in school. In support of this Executive Order, mask wearing is optional in all settings for employees, students, and visitors in the Washington County School District. There is no requirement by the Washington County School District to be vaccinated for COVID-19.

The following guidelines are for quarantine and isolation of students as outline by the Department of Health (Emergency Rule 64DER21-12):

If student tests positive for COVID-19, the student should not be with others until:

- 10 days since symptoms first appeared with at least 24 hours no fever without fever-reducing medication and Other symptoms of COVID-19 are improving **OR**
- Student receives a negative test and is asymptomatic

If exposed to someone with COVID-19, the student will need to quarantine in one of the following methods:

- •Until student receives a negative COVID-19 test after 4 days from date of last exposure **OR**
- •Until student is asymptomatic and 7 days have passed since the date of last exposure

Fully vaccinated individuals may:

•Refrain from quarantine following a known exposure if they remain asymptomatic

Fully vaccinated individuals should continue to watch for symptoms of COVID-19. Regardless of vaccination status, if symptoms develop, individuals should isolate and be evaluated for COVID-19, including testing if indicated. We will continue to work with the Washington County Health Department and monitor community transmission, vaccination coverage, screening testing, and occurrence of outbreaks to guide decisions on the prevention strategies.

01 PAUSE

Be surgical, not sweeping. Quickly assess and limit the impact.

02 STAY

If you feel sick or see symptoms of sickness, stay home or send home.

03 CLEAN


Schools should continue to encourage routine cleaning of classrooms and high-traffic areas.

Si se siente enfermo o ve síntomas de enfermedad, quédese en casa o envíe a la casa.


03 LIMPIAR
