New Workforce Pell Grant coming July 2026!

A new Workforce Pell Grant could help states connect more adults to workforce training by expanding eligibility to short-term, workforce-aligned education and training programs. Currently, the shortest program covered by PELL is 600 hours. This new option will reduce that to much shorter training programs.

Workforce Pell represents a new phase of federal investment in flexible workforce training that can scale in response to student and employer demand. For the first time, states will identify and approve eligible programs, while the U.S. Department of Education oversees program quality and performance.

The department plans to finalize regulations and launch the program on July 1, 2026. States are now working to incorporate the grant into broader workforce development strategies. As implementation begins, collaboration among states, institutions, and the Department of Education will be critical to ensuring a successful launch.

To maintain eligibility, qualifying programs must meet performance standards across three federal benchmarks:

- Completion rate: At least 70%. Students must complete the program within a set period, defined as 150% of the program's intended length. *For example, in eight-week programs, students would need to finish within 12 weeks to count toward successful completion.*
- Job placement rate: At least 70% of program completers must find employment in a field aligned with their training within 180 days of completing the program.
- Earnings "value" threshold: Programs must also meet a value benchmark known as the "median value-added earnings" test, which measures whether programs provide an earnings boost after considering program costs. Specifically, the value of the average earnings of the graduates, which is above a 150% federal poverty line, must be a larger value than the tuition and fees for the program.

Earnings will be measured three years after completion and adjusted for local cost of living.

Overall, this is a fantastic opportunity to offer vocational training to students who otherwise may not get the chance to enroll in longer programs.

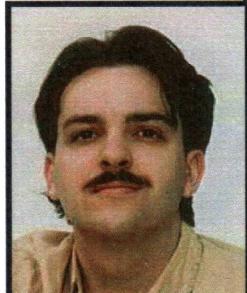
